We believe that Talk for Writing, developed by Pie Corbett supported by Julia Strong, is based on the principles of how children learn and is absolutely key to giving every child the understanding, support and freedom to be empowered as truly independent authors. As a National Training Centre with a resident School-based Consultant, we'd love for you to come and visit us and to work with you on Talk for Writing in your school.



Children cannot create out of nothing. They need both rich experience as well as a language bank inside the mind to draw upon. Where the reading of stories and poems is a regular part of daily life, children are helped to internalise a living library of poems and stories, like templates that can be used for their own imaginative flights of fancy. These children will acquire a store of patterns, rather like building blocks that can be used to imagine and invent stories. For instance, even the earliest stories read to young children involve them in drawing upon their reading as well as their immediate lives.

Teachers may be tempted into thinking that children are unimaginative. The issue is usually not a lack of imagination. Too often it is a lack of the building blocks of narrative. Imagination concerns manipulating what you know to create something new. However, it is not uncommon to find children arriving in school with a meagre diet of stories and rhymes. Indeed, many professionals who work with young children believe that language deprivation is increasing.

The approach in this book is based upon how children learn language – through imitation, innovation and invention of language.
