WILDLIFE MIGRATION DAY AT SAMPHIRE HOE!

#wildlifemigrationday

Species migrate to find shelter, food and to breed. There are large numbers of birds, including many types of ducks and



geese that arrive from other parts of the world to winter in Britain, while others leave Britain to spend the winter in warmer places. Birds have an inbuilt compass which allows them to detect the earth's magnetic field which helps them navigate.

Some travel as far as 5,000 miles from the UK.

MAKE NATURAL CHRISTMAS DECORATIONS

We have an event to make your very own Christmas decorations from natural materials you have collected yourself. Holly, hawthorn, oak and ivy leaves are collected from the scrub growing on the chalk downland and made into a beautiful door wreath (see left) for example. The red holly berries and red hawthorn berries (hawes) which contain the seeds of the trees and can also be used for decorating. Please see **Saturday 16 December** for details.



AUTUMN COLOURS AND WILD FOOD

Fungi are amazing organisms and they play an important role by recycling nutrients, breaking down dead wood and combining with many plants to help them grow. All true fungi are made up of microscopic thread-like roots called hyphae. Together the hyphae are known as mycelium which are mostly hidden underground or in rotten wood. The hyphae develop into what appears as a mushroom or puffball. Unlike most plants fungi cannot make their own food by photosynthesis (using the energy of the sun to make food). Instead they collect food from other organisms via the hyphae. **Never pick or eat wild mushrooms without expert advice as many poisonous mushrooms can be hard to identify.** Join a Fungi Foray on **Sunday 15 October** on Folkestone Downs to find out more about the different types of fungi that can be found there. **ALL CHILDREN MUST BE ACCOMPANIED

Children under 18 must be accompanied at all times by a parent or guardian. It is the responsibility of the adult to make sure that their children are safe and well behaved, not the responsibility of the leader of the event. Many events take time to set up beforehand, so please don't let unruly behaviour spoil the event for everyone else.

HAVE A GO AT VOLUNTEERING

Volunteer events are practical conservation days where local volunteers carry out practical work to improve the sites for wildlife and people. The leader will explain about the work and how to use the tools. You don't have to stay all day – why not come along for an hour or two. We provide gloves, as well as refreshments, but please wear old clothes that you don't mind getting dirty or torn, and boots that protect your toes and have good grip. Bring a cold drink and packed lunch if you want to stay all day. These events can also count towards your Junior Ranger totals. Contact us on 01304 241806 for more details.



THE GRADING SYSTEM (to help you choose a suitable walk):

- Grade 1 Very easy walk generally on pavements.
- Grade 2 Easy walk in the countryside with gentle hills. No stiles.
- Grade 3 Typical country walk with some steeper hills, stiles or muddy paths.
- Grade 4 More difficult walking with steep hills or likely to be very muddy paths.
- Grade 5 Difficult walks e.g. rocky shores or night walks.

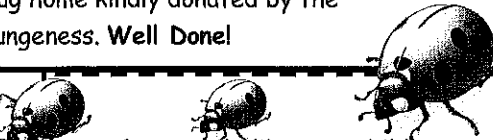
EXHIBITION: AMAZING WILD WEATHER

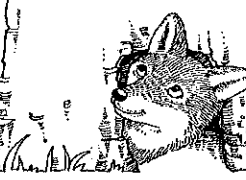


COMPETITION WINNERS
