We have had tremendous success this year in sporting competitions including winning the Herald Cup and the silver medal in both the year 3/4 and 5/6 Kent Hockey final.

We recently reapplied for the School Games Mark which assessed us against 4 criteria:

- Clubs how many local links does our school have with clubs or establishments from the area?
