Year 1: Toys and Games (Term 1)

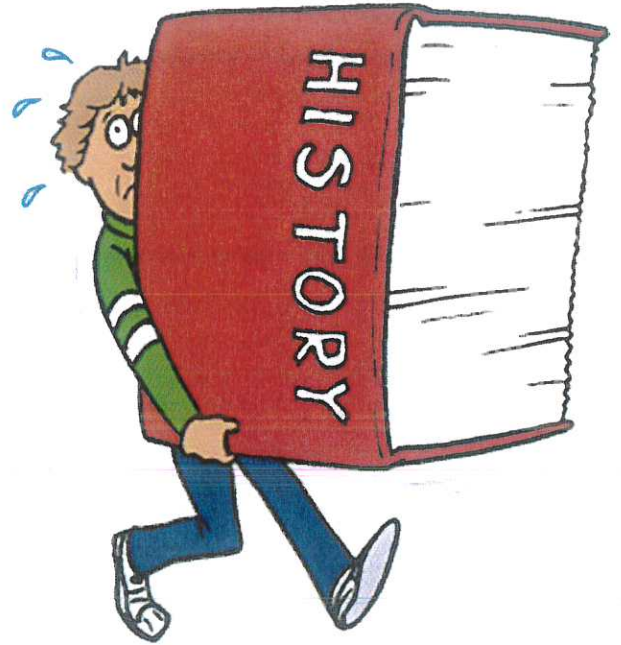
Year 2: Fire of London (Term 1)

Year 6: WW1 (Term 1) This topic will be studied alongside the class book: Private Peaceful.



During the course of the two terms, certain historical events will be addressed in Assemblies such as Guy Fawkes Night (5th November), Remembrance Day (11th November) and Black History Month which this year is the whole of October.

The aim of history is to inspire curiosity within the children and so it will often be the case that the teacher will present history as a clue finding activity, or will bring an investigative approach to the subject as well as making it as interactive as possible.
