Reading	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Selection of Ancient Egyptian non-fiction texts • Egyptian poetry • Apply knowledge of root words, prefixes/suffixes when reading aloud and understanding the meaning of unfamiliar words. • Read further exception words, noting unusual correspondences between spelling and sound and where these occur in the word. • Develop comprehension skills- focus on questioning and inference skills
SPAG	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Revision of Key stage 1 phonics + Year 3 Statutory spellings • Suffixes (-ly) • Extend range of sentences with more than 1 clause by using a wider range of conjunctions, including <i>when, if, because, although</i>. • Use the present perfect form of verbs in contrast to the past tense. • Introduce paragraphs as a way to group related material • Use headings and subheadings to aid presentation.
Maths	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Place Value, hundreds, tens and ones • Count from 0 in multiples of 4, 8, 50 and 100 • Addition and subtraction of 3 digit numbers, using formal columnar method and adding and subtracting amounts of money. • Make estimates and use inverse operation to check answers. • Balancing equations • Arithmetic – addition, subtraction, rapid recall multiplication and division • Problem Solving
Science	ANIMALS INCLUDING HUMANS <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • African animal study • Scientist study – Charles Darwin • Explain the different ways that plants and animals obtain food. • Explain the difference between food groups and nutrient groups • Explain what are the right types and amounts of nutrition for humans and explain the consequences related to eating the wrong type of diet. • Use scientific names to identify human bones and explain how the skeleton protects, supports and allows movement. • Set up and conduct a simple practical enquiry, and write an explanation of their findings.
