Earrings in PE/Swimming

Earrings must be removed before participating in PE lessons (including swimming).

If a child is not able to remove their own earrings, parents should do so before school on a PE day.

If there are exceptional circumstances which prevents this from being possible for a defined period of time, parents should provide a letter explaining the reasons and the date from which earrings can be removed. During this period the earrings will be made safe using micropore tape, however a teacher may ask a child wearing earrings not to participate in an activity if they feel the risk is sufficient.

As it is not appropriate to cover ears with micropore tape during swimming, children will therefore need to remove earrings before their session.

In addition, all jewellery must be removed for PE, including watches.
