




Further Guidance on using Accelerated Reader at home:

<p>Step 1</p> <p>Choose a book</p>	<p>You could:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Choose a book from home Find an ebook via MyOn: https://cutt.ly/EyqngNR Find an ebook via Collins Big Cat: https://cutt.ly/Pyqb79j Find an ebook via Oxford Owl: https://cutt.ly/byqb9VQ <p>Check whether it has a quiz using www.arbookfind.co.uk</p> <p>Top Tip: Sometimes, longer titles might have been worded strangely, so always try the author's last name as well!</p>	<div data-bbox="719 562 965 824"> <p>How to access free Collins Big Cat ebooks</p> <p>Access 330+ free KS1 ebooks from our primary reading programme</p> <p>Go to Collins Connect and click on the Teacher portal and enter:</p> <p>Username: parents@harpercollins.co.uk</p> <p>Password: Parents20!</p> <p>and click Login.</p> <p><small>*Please be aware that when you are using parent access to Collins Big Cat ebooks, you cannot use My Classes – any classes that are set up will disappear.*</small></p> </div> <div data-bbox="981 562 1342 824"> </div> <div data-bbox="719 835 1342 1077"> </div>
<p>Step 2</p> <p>Log in to AR</p>	<p>Log in to the Accelerated Reader website. You <u>must</u> use the below link (do not use a search engine) since each school has their own website: ukhosted56.renlearn.co.uk/1894764/</p> <p>Children should now log-in as a student, using the details they usually use in school.</p> <p>Then, click 'Accelerated Reader'.</p> <p>Top Tip: The username is usually a number, followed by the last name and first initial e.g. 15smiths and upper or lower case both work.</p>	
<p>Step 3</p> <p>Find the quiz</p>	<p>Search for the book you have read and then click 'Take Quiz,' remembering to choose the correct title, even if it has a different front cover picture!</p> <p>Top Tip: If the book was on the AR Book Find website then it will be here too. Remember, longer titles sometimes might have been worded strangely, so always try the author's last name as well!</p>	

<p>Step 4</p> <p>Complete the quiz</p>	<p>Read through each question and then choose the answer you think best matches what you have read. Remember you <u>can</u> check back through the book – it is not a memory test!</p> <p>Top Tip: If you have realised it is the wrong quiz or you need to stop it for any other reason, you can press 'Stop Quiz' on the top left corner. We have temporarily set the password to 'parents1'</p>	
<p>Step 5</p> <p>Celebrate!</p>	<p>Once you have finished each of the questions, time to celebrate! You have just proved you are a Reading Champion!</p> <p>Top Tip: Check the score over. If you got 80% or higher – great! If you got lower than 80% then maybe this book was too challenging or perhaps you missed some parts out. Be careful with your next choice of book.</p>	

Remember:

Quizzes are great! They allow you to check your understanding of what you have read, give you something to celebrate **and** let your teachers see how you have been doing...

...BUT...

...just remember, the most important thing is that you are reading:

- Do not worry if your book does not have a quiz available for it – perhaps you could write some questions for a quiz of your own for this one and next time use www.arbookfind.co.uk to find a book with a quiz on it. Don't forget there's e-books as well!
- Do not worry if you didn't score so well on the quiz – perhaps the book was too tricky and you should choose something with a slightly lower Book Level (BL) next time.
