

Saving Easter

Home Learning Challenges

The geese in the story help the Easter Bunny by laying lots of eggs. Could you make them some chocolate Easter nests to lay their eggs in? You could make them out of cornflakes or crispy rice cereal and melted chocolate and shape them into nests.



The Easter Bunny is great at hiding eggs. Can you play a hiding game with a friend or grown-up? Choose something to hide in your home or garden and ask your friend to find it. Can you think of any clues to give them?

The Easter Bunny's friends help to paint lots of lovely patterns on the eggs. Can you draw a large egg shape and decorate it with colourful patterns? You could use pens, paint or pencils.



The Easter Bunny has hidden 3 Easter eggs in a bush and 6 Easter eggs in a tree. How many eggs has she hidden altogether? Can you draw the eggs and count them?

Bunny begins with a 'b'. Go on a 'b' sound walk and see how many things you can spot that begin with 'b'.

In the story 'Saving Easter', the Easter Bunny made some new friends. Talk about who your friends are and why you like them.

Home Learning Challenges

Make some Easter treats to share with your family. You could make biscuits or cakes and decorate them too!



Jaya and Ali like taking photos of all the things they see and do over Easter. Ask a grown-up to help you take some photos. You could use a tablet, a camera or a phone. Ask a grown-up if you can print your favourite photo to bring in and share with your friends.

Jaya and Ali have fun painting Easter eggs. Try painting or decorating your own egg. You could paint a hard-boiled egg or use a plastic egg instead. You could also draw and decorate a paper egg. What pictures can you draw on your egg? What else could you use to decorate your egg?



Easter time is the perfect time for planting some flowers. Plant some flowers or seeds with a grown-up. What do you need to do to look after the plants and help them grow?



In the story, Jaya and Ali take photos and write about all the fun things they do over Easter. Make your own Easter journal over the school holiday. Take photos or draw pictures and write about some of the things you do with your family and friends.

Hidden around this page are lots of Easter eggs. How many spotty eggs can you find? How many stripy eggs can you find? How many eggs are there altogether?






Easter Themed Basket Craft

4. Fill your box with Easter goodies.





Throw and catch a ball with a friend.






