Last week we trialled a hot dinner option by holding a Fish and Chip day; this served a number of purposes.

Firstly, it supported our funding as some aspects of this are directly linked to the number of pupils having a school meal on 'census day'. The uptake was high with very little difference between last year and this year.

Secondly, it allowed us to experiment with ways to get hot meals to the children safely, at the right temperature, and without the need for staff to enter multiple classrooms. This too was a success.

Lastly, the experiment enabled the school to form a proposal to put to our caterers about how we might expand our hot dinner options for the children. After holding a meeting earlier this week, I am pleased to be able to tell you that, from Monday, we have altered our menu to include three hot meal options each week. After half term this will be increased further.

Not only does this allow children greater access to a hot healthy meal during the school day, but it also supports our catering staff who are a valued part of our Sandgate team.
