This is your themed learning for Art:

While the Weather is Cold – Ice Sculptures

Read about these artists and then try making an ice art creation of your own.



1.) Azuma Makota

The artist who encases flowers in the blocks of ice.

Azuma Makota is a Japanese artist who explores plants represented in different environments. For his "Iced Flowers" series, he put some flowers into the blocks of ice to observe how their state would change.



2.) Andy Goldsworthy

The artist who collaborates with nature to create his art works.

A famous British sculptor, photographer and environmentalist, Andy Goldsworthy represents the new generation of land art. He works with ice, snow and frost as well as many others nature materials.

3.) Richard Shilling

British land artist who uses variety of natural materials.

Inspired by the work of Andy Goldsworthy, Richard Shilling explores themes like time, ecology and the constant change of the seasons using nature materials and photography.



How to Make Your Own Ice Art Creation Of Your Own!

1. Find some items to freeze inside your ice creation. This could be items found outside in nature or colourful/interesting objects in your home (check first with an adult that it's okay to use what you have chosen!).
2. Place the items you have found inside a balloon or empty plastic container (you could also use silicone moulds/ice cube trays).
3. Fill with water until it is the size and shape you would like your piece of art to be.
4. Add string if you wish to hang your piece of art (make sure it's securely in the water).
5. Pop it in the freezer overnight.
6. Take it out of the freezer and remove from the container or mould/remove the balloon.
7. Display your ice creation and upload a photo on Google Classroom!
