Welcome back and what a glorious first week back it has been. Nothing indicates the first sign of Summer in school better than the children being able to use the field at playtime once more! This small but welcome step is of great value to the children's wellbeing so I hope you all found similar ways to spend time together as a family during the Easter break. Changes in how the school is operating are minimal. Classes still operate in 'bubbles' and the Hands, Face, Space and Fresh Air message remains key, not just to the children, but to us all. To this end, your support in the continuation of distancing and wearing masks while on the school site is appreciated.

From Monday, children will be able to leave their bikes and scooters at school again, but please do read the letter that we are sending about this as each class will have a different area to use. Once children are through the school gates, bikes and scooters should be wheeled to the parking areas rather than ridden.

The staff began this week with a development day which focussed on reading. Our in-school analysis of reading during lockdown, both in terms of the quantity of reading and assessment outcomes, shows that partial school closures has had an impact in this area. Not only that, our research using historical school data shows a strong correlation between outcomes in reading to those in almost all other subject areas. To help with the children's 'catch-up', asking them to read every day at home will be of huge benefit to them. I know how difficult this can sometimes be to fit in with busy lives, but it is so important that children have this opportunity.

We have three new members of staff starting with us this term: Mr Walterus (year 5 teacher), Miss Ware (year 2 TA) and Miss Carter (MDMS). They will soon become familiar faces to you all I am sure.

Parent consultations take place during the last week of this term. These will be via Zoom as the feedback was so positive when we used this last time. If there is anything you wish to discuss with the class teacher before these meetings, we are always here to help.
