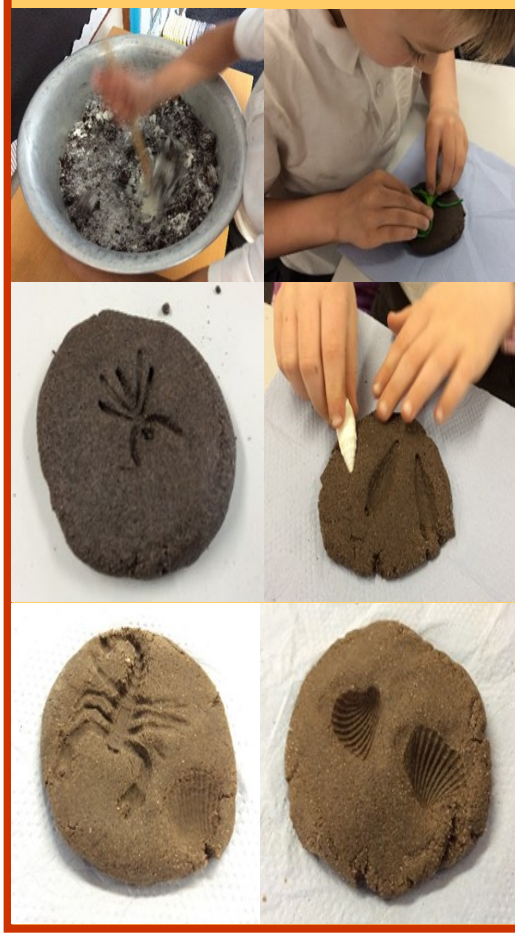

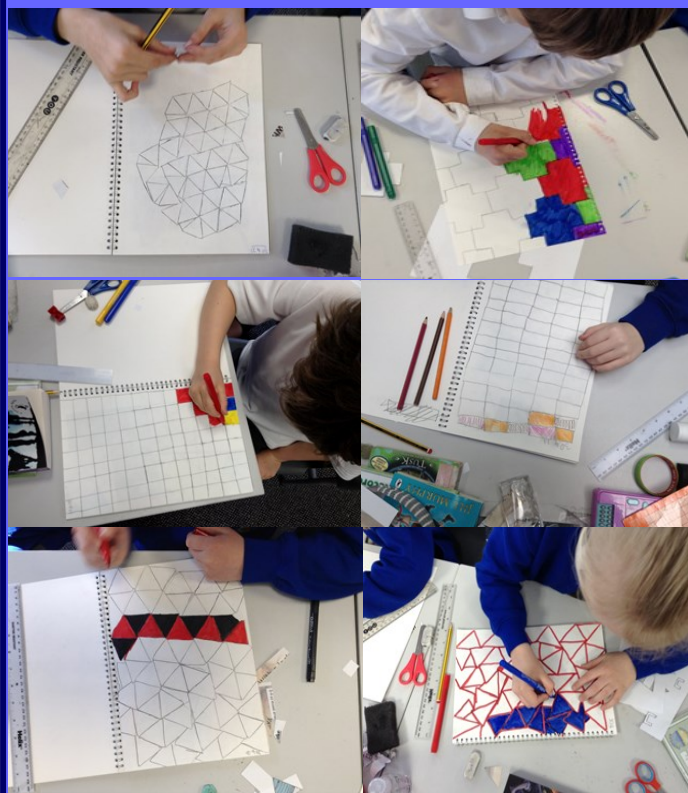
Please support your local community by taking part in this fun event and spreading the word – the more stalls the better! If you don't think you have enough things to sell, why not team up with a neighbour?
