To see so many children leaving school yesterday excitedly telling family all about their new teaching team was pleasing and demonstrated how successful moving up day was. Although children were unable to visit their new classroom, spending time getting to know teachers and TAs was still very valuable and reassuring to them.

As we look ahead to the new academic year, I am delighted to be able to announce that we will be running weekly Forest School sessions from September. Mr Walterus is an experienced Forest School teacher who has put a lot of work into shaping and resourcing the sessions which all children will participate in over the course of the year. Each term, a different year group will spend one whole afternoon outside in the Forest School area learning new skills, participating in team building and building resilience, all of which will have a positive impact on their wellbeing.

There is still a lot of work to do getting things ready – including moving the fence to increase the size of the wooded area, installing a new fire pit and building a base camp – but it will be worth it in order to provide the children with this experience.

There will be further information sent out before we return in September.

Many of you will have seen letters sent by a few schools, which have gone viral on social media, regarding the Men's Euro 2020 final on Sunday night. Although Sandgate will not be releasing their own such letter, I do understand that some families will wish their children to watch the match, therefore I will leave it to you to decide on the significance you place on this event. If your child is going to be late into school on Monday please let us know as we still need to account for the whereabouts of all children meaning, that unless you have informed us, you will be getting a phone call on Monday morning. This is standard safeguarding practice and not a reaction by the school to any decision you may have made.

Gareth Southgate and Marcus Rashford are both included in next year's Sandgate Values album, not because of their success in the tournament, but because of the way they have used their voice and influence to address inequality and discrimination. If you do get the chance to speak to the children about this over the weekend or coming weeks, it will give them a strong foundation for the discussions we will be having in school from September.
