	 To know that a force causes an object to start moving, stop moving, speed up, slow down or charge direction. To know that Gravity is a pulling force that acts at a distance. Medication



All medication your child requires daily or for emergencies (epi-pen, inhaler,..) should be in school and will go back home at the end of the year.

Walking home



We have a list of children who are allowed to walk home independently. If you would like your child to leave school without an adult, please have this in writing and hand it in to the office or class Teacher/TA.

If there are last minute changes in who is collecting your child, please phone or email the office in advance. Without written or verbal permission, we can't let your child leave with any other adult or on their own.

Home Learning

Home learning is set on every Wednesday and due in the following Tuesday.

It is split into Reading, Spelling and Maths.



Reading – Children should read for **30 minutes** or more, at **least 5 times per week.** Wherever possible, they do this with an adult and <u>most</u> of the time, read a book in the colour band or Accelerated Reader reading range. Adults need to write a comment in the reading record at least once per week.

Spelling – Learning activities that link to weekly spelling patterns taught in school. This is a great way of consolidating your child's learning.

Maths – <u>Mathletics:</u> an online learning platform that offers the children activities that follow learning in class and another great way for consolidation.

<u>TTRS:</u> class teachers will contact the parents of children who would benefit from regular times tables practice on TTRS. This decision will be based on a recent assessment.

Mathletics




In Year 5, children use Mathletics for home learning. This is an online platform where they can complete small tasks set by the teacher that relate to our maths learning in

class.

Your to do list

Every child has been given their own log in details which they stuck in their reading records.

Reading Journals:

An adult at home will be expected to write at least one comment a week.

Children are expected to take ownership of this book and write their own comments, as well as do their own reading activities.

As class teachers, we will hear your child read regularly and check their reading journals are being kept up to date.

Some children will be heard daily.

We want all children to become FANTASTIC, FLUENT YEAR FIVE Readers. This is a partnership between school and home.

When we hear your child read, we might give them a target numbers of pages to read, this will be checked and rewarded!

When your child finishes a book they should complete a quiz on AR (they can take these at home or sometimes in class).

Trips

Currently, we have two planned trips in Year 5

- 1. Canterbury Cathedral (Term 1)
- 2. Port Lympne (residential-Term 5)

For every trip, a letter will go out asking for permission from parents or carers.

Please make sure you fill out and return the permission slips asap so we can plan a safe trip and get all of our risk assessments in place.

Early learning

Early learning (8.30 – 8.55) is a very valuable time for your child.

The earlier your child can be in school, the more they will benefit from this time in which they respond to feedback in books, read with an adult or have a chance to revisit misconceptions from the day before.

Ukulele

In Year 5, children receive ukulele lessons every week for the whole academic year.

They will be taught by Miss Timms every Friday.

Every child will be given a ukulele to be able to practice at home. They will be expected to bring in their ukuleles on **Thursdays** so they are definitely in by Friday.

If children have their own ukuleles, they are allowed to use those and bring them in to school at their own risk.

If children forget to bring in their ukulele, parents will be contacted and asked to bring it in if possible.

Ukulele

This year, every child will be set up with a YMU account. YUMU is a fun and engaging online learning platform which children can access from home.



Although we don't set ukulele practice as home learning, we highly recommend children practice for at least 15 -20 min/week.
