On Tuesday and Wednesday, we were very lucky to have some exciting visitors in our school, delivering Indian dance workshops and performances.

Sujata Banerjee, Tulani Kayani and Aniruddha Mukherjee led workshops with Year 4 and Year 6, who then each gave impressive performances to the rest of the school at the end of each day.

Sujata is one of the top South Asian dance teachers in the country, specialising in Khatak Classical Dance . Recently, 'In 2019, Sujata received two major awards; MBE, Queen's award for her outstanding service to Dance and also the prestigious 'Lifetime Achievement Award' from the One Dance UK for education and participation'.

She was joined by Tulani, a talented dancer and teacher, who has won many awards including The BBC Young Dancer South Asian category.

Tabla player, Aniruddha, accompanied all the workshops and performances and the children loved his playful approach and rhythm games.

The workshops and performances had strong links to our curriculum and our school values. They involved story telling and discussions about themes such as the journey of life and how it relates to Hinduism (Year 4), as well as Empire and Colonialism (Year 6). They were great fun to take part in, truly inspiring and a fantastic opportunity for all our children to take part in and watch, on so many different levels. We were so impressed by the way our children were so engaged and able to perform after just three and a half hours of focused teaching.

The workshops were the conclusion of Sujata Banerjee Dance Company's Hemantika Festival, a two week festival showcasing South Asian dance and our participation was the only event outside of London.





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
