We have really enjoyed hearing about the children's half terms this week; it sounds like they all had a great time! And they all deserve a big well done for coming back to school with so much enthusiasm, ready for the term ahead.

Another 'well done' is needed for the fantastic Black History Month home learning projects we received this week. It was great to share these in our classes and they are now proudly on display in the corridor, for others to see.

We had a great start to our 'toys' topic this week, with the children particularly enjoying bringing in their teddies on Wednesday. We loved seeing these and hearing lots of stories about the children's favourite toys.

In English, the children have started to learn our new model text, Nothing, and have used this to complete their Cold Task, for which they drew and labelled key characters and events from the story. We are so impressed with how hard the children worked on this special piece of learning, and it's amazing to see the progress all the children have already made this year. We then used a story map to help us come up with actions for our new model text. The children always love doing this and came up with some fantastic actions.

In Maths this week, we have focused on the number 5 and how this can be represented using a die frame (see the image below). We also considered how our fingers can help us represent 5 and we discussed 5 and 5 making 10 altogether.



Thank you for continuing to read with your child and for helping them to learn their sounds. You will find this week's new sounds in their book bags today (y, z, qu, ch). You will notice that this week, the children learnt diagraphs (qu and ch), where two letters make one sound.
