Competition Guidelines

The task is to produce a written or typed story in prose entitled **'Rebuilding'**. The written entry could be fiction or non-fiction, a prose or a poem, as long as the piece relates to the theme. Questions have been asked about spelling and although this is not an issue, the only advice to be given are that judges of this competition have made comment upon spelling in the past.

For prose entries – an A4 page or 500 hundred words is a suggested suitable submission; up to a maximum of 40 lines for poetry entries.

Entries for the local round of the competition must be submitted by 1st March 2024.
