Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back to Term 5; we hope you had an enjoyable and relaxing Easter holiday.

We have had such an exciting first week back. On Tuesday, we had a parcel delivered and inside there was a pot containing 5 tiny caterpillars, which Mrs Hughes has asked us to look after. We are very excited to see them grow and move through the lifecycle, as they change into butterflies, and we will be sure to keep you updated on their progress.

In keeping with the theme of caterpillars, this week we began to learn the story of 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' and the children completed their Cold Tasks.

In Maths, we have continued to engage in activities that draw attention to the purpose of counting, which is to find out 'how many' objects there are. We also revisited the concept of cardinality, which is the idea that the last number in the count tells us how many things there are altogether.

The children have been introduced to wide range of subjects in the wider curriculum this week, from special celebrations in RE; to screen time and alternatives to screen time, in Computing; to the monarchy, in History. We will continue to learn more about these topics throughout the term. The children have also enjoyed the introduction of an Explorer Time focus this week. This week's focus was on observational drawing/painting. The paintings that the children chose to produce were of excellent quality and it is clear to see the time and attention that went into them. Well done Ladybirds and Bumblebees; you are brilliant artists!

A highlight for many of the children this week was Balanceability, which began in our PE sessions. These sessions help children coordinate and use a balance bike and the children will explore ways to travel, move and weave the bikes, focussing on stopping swiftly when asked to do so.

As always, please ensure you are writing in the home-school diary when you and your child have read their reading book and sharing book, and ensure that they are in their bookbags, so that we can change them on a Monday.
