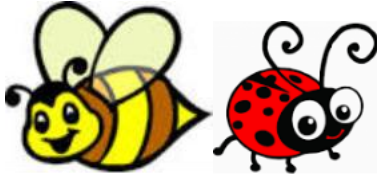


Dear Ladybirds and Bumblebees,

Week beginning 9th March 2026

Dear Parents/Carers,

This week in Literacy, we have been focusing on writing 'A New Home for a Pirate' bit by bit each day, making our own changes to the settings in the story. We have heard some great ideas being shared and seen some wonderful sentences being written. Well, done Ladybirds and Bumblebees!

In Maths, we have been looking at the number 7 in greater depth and considering the parts of 7, such as 5 and 2.

In the wider curriculum, our People and Communities learning focused on places that are special to us and places that are special to Christians (churches) and Muslims (mosques). Our Natural World learning focused on the properties of various materials, including being waterproof, and we considered what makes a boat float or sink.

In Phonics, we are approaching the end of Phase 4, which has been a consolidation phase, during which we have focused on common consonant clusters (for example, 'fr' and 'st' this week), spotting digraphs and trigraphs in words, and reading longer words and short sentences.

Thank you for continuing to read with your children and for practising their sound and Rainbow Word flashcards with them.

As a reminder, individual sound books and phase 2, 3 and 4 books are changed on Friday and sharing books are changed on a Tuesday. Please continue to tick the table, write a short note to let us know when you have read with your child, how they are getting on with their reading at home, and when they have completed their book. Re-reading books is great for improving the children's fluency and confidence and is particularly important for the phase 4 reading books.

We continue to be very grateful for any donations of junk modelling materials from your recycling. In particular, we are looking for small boxes, toilet/kitchen roll tubes, and clean plastic bottles. Thank you in advance.

Vocabulary we will be introducing next week:

PSHE

- Personal hygiene -how we care for our bodies and keep them clean, including activities such as washing our hands, brushing our teeth, and bathing

Creating with Materials

- Primary colours – red, blue, yellow. These colours can be mixed to make new colours. They cannot be made by mixing other colours
- Secondary colours – the colours made by mixing two primary colours

People and Communities

- Altar – a raised table or platform used for religious ceremonies in a church
- Pew – a church bench
- Font – a basin where Baptisms are performed
- Prayer mat – a mat or small rug that Muslims kneel on when they pray
